How to set the Adobe Flash Player Security settings

If you receive the following message (shown in screen capture) when you try to open a module or while trying to open the demonstrations, you will need to add the location of the file in order to access the demos.

Please follow these steps to allow the Flash interaction:

1. Click the **Settings** button in the **Adobe Flash Player Security** message box (as seen in this screen capture).

How to Allow Browser Pop-ups for the Mini-Boot Camp Program

A pop-up is a small web-browser window that opens up. In the *Introduction to System z Mini-Boot Camp*, pop-ups are intentionally used to present various types of information to the user. Be sure that the web browser allows pop-ups while using the course. Pop-up blocker can be reset when not taking the course.

To turn it off, or to turn it on again if you've already turned it off, follow the steps for your browser.

Internet Explorer

Pop-up Blocker is turned on in Internet Explorer by default.

- 1. From the Internet Explorer menu bar, select **Tools** > **Pop-up Blocker**.
- 2. Click Turn Off Pop-up Blocker.

FireFox

- 1. From the Internet Explorer menu bar, select **Tools** > **Options**.
- 2. Click **Content** from the menu.
- 3. Ensure the **Block Pop-up windows** is unchecked and click **OK**.

Note: If it is checked, click the **Exceptions** button and enter the URL of the *Introduction to System z Mini-Boot Camp* site.
